Bruno Liebhaberg

Director General, CERRE

Bruno Liebhaberg leads the think tank, CERRE. He is also the Chair of the EU Observatory on the Online Platform Economy. He was a professor at the Université libre de Bruxelles' Solvay Brussels School of Economics and Management (1979 to 2018). Earlier in his career, Mr Liebhaberg advised former European Commission President Jacques Delors on industry and R&D matters. He holds a Master's degree in Management Sciences from SBS-EM ULB and a PhD from the London School of Economics and Political Science.



Sébastien Soriano

Chairman, Arcep

Chairman of Arcep, the French regulatory authority for telecommunications, Sébastien Soriano is a former Chair and Vice Chair of BEREC. He was the Chief of Staff to Fleur Pellerin, during the latter's time as French Minister for SMEs, Innovation and Digital Economy. He also served a Special Advisor to the French Minister for Culture and Communication.



Alexandre de Streel

Joint Academic Director, CERRE
Professor of EU Law, University of Namur

Alexandre de Streel is a Joint Academic Director of CERRE and Professor of European Law at the Universities of Namur and Louvain. He is also the Director of the Research Centre for Information, Law and Society (CRIDS) of the University of Namur. He regularly advises international organisations and national regulatory authorities on regulatory and competition issues in network industries. He holds a PhD in Law from the European University Institute.



Philippe Van Parijs

Hoover Chair of Economics and Social Ethics, University of Louvain
Visiting Professor, Oxford Faculty of Law

Professor Philippe Van Parijs is a renowned political philosopher and political economist. A Professor at the Faculty of Economic, Social and Political Sciences of the University of Louvain, he has been holding the the Hoover Chair of Economic and Social Ethics since its creation in 1991. He is also a Visiting Professor at the Faculty of Law of the University of Oxford. He was awarded the *Francois Prize*, Belgium's most prestigious scientific recognition, and the *Arkprijs voor het Vrije Woord*, which honours public personalities who illustrate the freedom to speak out. He has authored many books including *After the Storm. How to save democracy in Europe*.
